Admission Requirements

- Holders of an Upper Second Class Honors degree of the University of Nairobi in any discipline or an equivalent qualification from a recognised University
- Holders of a Lower Second Class Honors degree of the University of Nairobi in any discipline or an equivalent qualification PLUS two years post graduation work experience in journalism, Communication and related fields such as public Relations, Advertising and Advocacy.
- Holders of a Pass Second degree of the University of Nairobi in any discipline or an equivalent qualification from a

recognised University PLUS a Postgraduate Diploma and relevant work experience of five years

- A Level (2 Principal passes and 1 subsidiary pass) or equivalent.

In each of the above cases applicants must have a minimum of C+/Credit in English or Kiswahili.

Admission Requirements

A holder of a Masters degree in a discipline relevant to Journalism and Mass Communication from an institution recognized by the University of Nairobi Senate.

- K.C.S.E. mean grade C+ and above or equivalent, with a C+ in Mathematics; or
- K.C.S.E. mean grade C (plain) and above or equivalent, with a C+ in Mathematics Plus a Diploma (including IB Diploma) or equivalent from a recognized post-secondary institution; or
- K.C.E./E.A.C.E. Div. II/Ordinary G.C.E. or equivalent with credit in Mathematics Plus a Diploma (including IB Diploma) or equivalent from a recognized post-secondary institution; or
- K.A.C.E. or E.A.C.E./Advanced G.C.E. certificate with two principal passes or equivalent, with credit in "O" level Mathematics; or
- A degree from a recognized University or equivalent.

MASTER OF ARTS IN ECONOMIC POLICY MANAGEMENT

Admission Requirements

- The common regulation for the admission and registration in Masters degree in the University of Nairobi shall apply.
- In addition, the following shall be eligible for registration for the Masters programme.
 - Holders of at least an Upper Second Class Honours degree in Economics.
 - Holders of degree or equivalent qualifications from other institutions recognized by the Senate of the University of Nairobi as being on comparable academic status to those in (a) above.

MASTER OF ARTS IN ECONOMICS OF MULTILATERAL TRADING SYSTEMS

Admission Requirements

- The common regulation for the admission and registration in a Masters degree in the University of Nairobi shall apply.
- In addition, the following shall be eligible for registration for the Masters programme; (i) Holders of at least a Lower Second Class Honours degree in Economics with two years experience in Multilateral Trading Systems.

MASTER OF SCIENCE IN HEALTH ECONOMICS & POLICY (MSC. HEP)

Admission Requirements

- The common regulations for admission and registration in a Masters Degree in the University of Nairobi and the School of Economics shall apply.

- In addition the following shall be eligible for admission for the Masters programme.
 - Holders of Bachelors degree at Upper Second Class Honors in Economics, Health Sciences or other related disciplines from the University of Nairobi or other institutions recognized by Senate.
 - Holders of Bachelors degree at Lower Second Class from the University of Nairobi or other Institutions recognized by Senate, with at least two years relevant post qualification working experience.
 - Holders of a Pass degree and a relevant Postgraduate Diploma from the University of Nairobi or other institutions recognized by Senate.
 - Holders of a Pass degree from the University of Nairobi or other institutions recognized by Senate, with at least five years relevant post qualification working experience.
